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Innovation

With the introduction of the 964, Porsche offered the all-wheel-drive 911 Carrera 4 from 1988. It also included an automatically extending rear spoiler, dual ignition, knock control and a three-way catalytic converter. Porsche launched its Tiptronic automatic transmission in 1989. From 1991, Porsche equipped all 911 models with driver and passenger airbags as standard. The Carrera 4 was the first

passenger vehicle fitted with a metal catalytic converter as standard.

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
