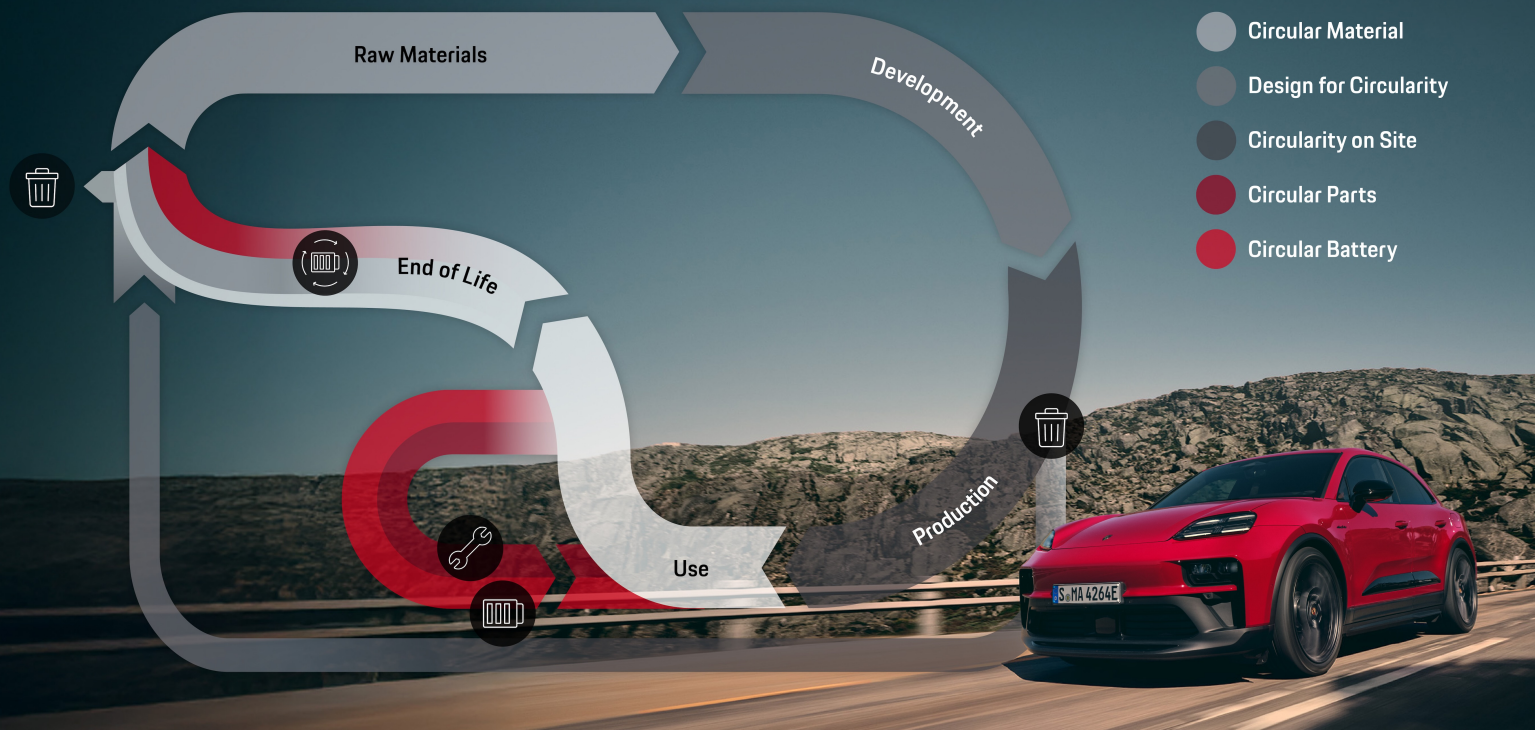




Circular economy

Porsche aims to use raw materials responsibly and in a way that preserves resources, while ensuring a long service life for its vehicles and the materials used in them. The strategic field “Circular Economy” focuses on implementing and continuously improving circularity-oriented concepts along the vehicle value chain.

Where technically and economically feasible, the sports car manufacturer strives to use more environmentally sustainable materials — for example by reducing the share of primary raw materials and establishing closed material loops. This includes projects such as circularity concepts for high-voltage batteries, the use of circular materials, waste reduction initiatives, and the remanufacturing of vehicle components.
